Specializing in portraiture, multimedia installations, and photojournalism, Wood's images expertly spotlight womanhood, marginalized communities, and personal experiences that have profoundly influenced her life. Wood's photography offers audiences an authentic perspective on her subjects, as seen in her previous installations, The Herstory Project and Portraits of the Crossroads.

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


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
